## Come Visit the New EC Playground

If you have not recently visited our newly-outfitted Early Childhood playground, I invite you to do so. Over the spring break the final large piece of climbing equipment was installed, and it is wonderful. It was great to see the smiles on the faces of our students as they came outside to play for the first time since returning from vacation and they saw what they called their new 'toy.'

Since opening the playground in the fall we have added back the bicycle 'race-track', added a new, large covered sand box and five new pieces of large climbing equipment. All of the new equipment is designed to increase our EC students' gross motor skills, improve their hand-eye coordination, increase their cardio-vascular conditioning, improve their muscle tone, and of course give them the opportunity to have fun, run around, climb, slide, and tumble.

We want to thank the Bertsch Family Foundation for its ongoing and generous support of our school, including a generous donation for these final few pieces of large playground equipment. Funding for the playground itself and for some of the other equipment came from the Partnership for a Jewish Center (PJC). The PJC is a partnership between Lerner and the Federation to raise the \$7 million that funded our new EC wing (\$1.2 million) and will fund the construction of a JCC right next door. We anticipate that the construction of the JCC will begin some time this summer or early fall. ## **Parshat Hashavua:** Tazria/Metzora

God gives Moses instructions for the rites of purification and the sacrifices that must be made in order to complete the process of ritual purification. Provisions are made so a poor person can bring less costly sacrifices.

God also tells Moses that once the people have settled in the land of Canaan a person may discover some sort of plague on the walls of his home. A priest must examine it; if he declares that the house is afflicted with tzara'at, (a "rash") the affected stones must be removed and replaced. If the tzara'at returns, the house must be demolished. If it does not return, the priest will perform the specified ritual of purification.

It has been interesting visiting the classes as they work on their Tikkun Olam projects: if you were in school this week you might have seen the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students listening intently as Susan Springer talked to them about the problem of illiteracy in Durham; or you may have stepped into the kindergarten as they were talking about their food drive and why some children right here in our area may not have enough to eat; you might have run into a few 1<sup>st</sup> grade students collecting recycling from each of the classrooms; or you might have seen other 1<sup>st</sup> graders collecting the trash from each class and weighing it to find out the total amount of trash we generate here at Lerner each day; you might even have seen the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students walking the track with baskets filled with weights on their heads as Fiona and Jordan helped them understand some of the challenges that are faced by many people in our world in just bringing water to their homes.

As the students have been working on these projects they have also been reading and writing poetry. On the evening of the 13<sup>th</sup> you will have any opportunity to see the results of the work they have been doing as well as to hear poetry recitation in each class.
